## The literary structure of Mark 7:24-31 - The Syrophoenician woman's faith

- **A. Tyre and Sidon:** <sup>24</sup>And from there he arose and went away to the region of Tyre and Sidon.
  - **B. Jesus in a house:** And he entered a house and did not want anyone to know, yet he could not be hidden. <sup>25</sup>But immediately a woman whose little daughter had an unclean spirit heard of him and came and fell down at his feet.
    - **C. The request:** <sup>26</sup>Now the woman was a Gentile, a Syrophoenician by birth. And she begged him to cast the demon out of her daughter.
      - **D. Children's bread/dogs:** <sup>27</sup>And he said to her, "Let the children be fed first, for it is not right to take the children's bread and throw it to the dogs."
      - **D¹. Dogs/children's crumbs:** <sup>28</sup>But she answered him, "Yes, Lord; yet even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs."
    - C¹. The answer: <sup>29</sup>And he said to her, "For this statement you may go your way; the demon has left your daughter."
  - **B¹. The woman in her house:** <sup>30</sup>And she went home and found the child lying in bed and the demon gone.
- **A¹. Tyre and Sidon:** <sup>31</sup>Then he returned from the region of Tyre and went through Sidon to the Sea of Galilee, in the region of the Decapolis.
